

RODENT TREATMENT CLIENT PREPARATION SHEET

Before our arrival please review and complete all the necessary preparations listed below. These steps will ensure that your Technician is able to provide an effective and safe treatment.

How To Prepare For Your Treatment

Do not remove rodent feces from any areas before inspection (this will allow the technician to determine the level of activity, population, etc). Feces must be removed correctly.



KITCHEN

Empty only ground level cupboards and drawers of all foods etc including the sink. All surfaces must be clean and grease-free, especially around the fridge, stove, microwave and toaster. Throw out garbage and ensure dirty dishes are not left out overnight. Garbage bins must have a lid.



GARAGE

Remove any obstacles on the ground level near or around the inside walls that are attached to the home.



BALCONY & DECK

Remove bird feeders from decks or back yards and clean up spilled seed for the duration the treatment.



LAUNDRY ROOM

Remove any obstacles near or around laundry machines especially the plumbing lines.



PETS

Make sure pet food is secured in sealed heavy-duty plastic containers and is not left out after the pets have fed.



BASEMENT & CRAWL SPACE

Remove any obstacles near or around electrical panels, furnace units, air exchange units.



GENERAL

All items must be moved 2 feet from heaters. Reduce Clutter! Mice hide in cluttered areas and they use paper to build nests. Ensure the area next to the outside walls and the garage and storage areas are neat and tidy.



ATTIC & STORAGE AREAS

Remove any obstacles around or leading to the attic access door. Remove all items on ground floor.

After Your Treatment

The rodent control program is only effective if the following steps are taken after your home is serviced:

- No foods can be exposed on shelves, cupboards, pantries/benches etc unless it is canned goods or sealed in hard plastic or metal containers.
- Put **ALL** foodstuffs in tightly sealable containers. This means vegetables and breads. Rice/flour must be put in a metal/plastic sealed container, bags that they come in are not sufficient.
- Clean, especially around stoves, behind and underneath stoves and fridges. Do not leave exposed garbage underneath the sink.
- Don't create clutter. Keep things neat and tidy.
- **DO NOT** use any other rodent control products (this can work against the control measures put in place).
- Buy a sealable garbage can for any food leftovers.
- If you have pets, do not leave out dog, cat or bird food overnight. Once your pet has finished its meal, please put the food and bowl (or thoroughly clean it) in the fridge or in a sealed container.
- Clean kitchen floors regularly after cooking. Grease and food spills can sustain a mouse population! Vacuum and clean around all eating areas.
- **DO NOT** move any of the stations or traps.
- Follow the technician's recommendations for any repairs needed to close entry points.

Your technician will return after the treatment has been completed to remove all baits and traps. This should be arranged prior to service.

Reminder

It is not necessary for you or your pets to leave your home before, during or after the treatment. Please be patient, depending on the infestation level, the treatment can take a period of time.

What You Can Expect From Your Treatment

Your technician will start by checking the exterior and interior of your home for obvious entry points for the rodent and recommend repair options. A single control measure may not be effective against more severe infestations so each case is entirely unique. Your technician may set up and implement a program using baited mouse traps with rodenticide, mechanical traps and glue boards where deemed necessary. Extreme caution and safety is exercised when implementing control measures including placing baited traps in tamper resistant secured stations and in areas that are as inaccessible (to people & pets) as possible. All treatments will be made with your safety in mind to ensure your health.
